The Major in Gender, Women's, and Sexuality Studies requires the following:

- 1) Introduction to Gender, Women's, and Sexuality Studies (GWS 111)
- 2) Theory and Methodology in Gender, Women's, and Sexuality Studies (GWS 249)
- 3) Five courses (20 credits) from *at least three* of the four thematic rubrics listed below:
 - a. Sexuality and Queer Studies
 - b. Cross-Cultural and Transnational Approaches
 - c. Literary Criticism and Visual Culture
 - d. Political/Philosophical/Historical/Social Analyses
- 4) At least *two* of these five courses (or 8 credits) must be at the 300-level
- 5) Senior Seminar in Gender, Women's, and Sexuality Studies (GWS 495)
